

## <u>WHO ARE MANDATED REPORTERS?</u> As members of the FFT, we are all recognized as mandated reporters in New York State.

School professionals including (but not limited to) teachers, guidance counselors, psychologists, social workers, nurses, and administrators are all required to report suspected child abuse or maltreatment. A report is made when the mandated reporter, while acting in his or her official or professional capacity, is presented with a reasonable cause to suspect child abuse or maltreatment in a situation. Your suspicion can be as simple as distrusting an explanation for an injury.

As soon as you suspect abuse or maltreatment, YOU MUST REPORT YOUR CONCERNS by telephone to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR). The SCR is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to receive your call. **Mandated Reporters Call (800) 635-1522** 

You do not need to notify, or receive permission from, an administrator. It is your legal responsibility to make the report.

The Social Services Law provides confidentiality for all mandated reporters and all sources of child abuse and maltreatment reports. If a report is made with earnest concern for the welfare of a child, the reporter is immune from any criminal or civil liability that might result. This is referred to as making a report in "good faith."

Anyone who is mandated to report suspicions and fails to do so, could be charged with a Class A misdemeanor and be subject to criminal penalties. Further, mandated reporters can be sued in a civil court for monetary damages for any harm caused by the mandated reporter's failure to make a report to SCR.
